Then we will have a little text of preface of me and Harald, a more philosophical text on fragmentation in live and town amd society from an turkish writer; with the single artists and works we will have short texts and would really like to write about - around - your work. What do you think, would this be ok?

I'm curious to hear from you and to see you again in March - and then in September in Istanbul again!
