In January 1994 I did an installation called (Chronography. The basic material used in the project consisted of enlarged colour photocopies of 60 covers from radic magazines dating from 1950 to 1953. I was trying in this work to approach the very middle years of this century now coming to a close with the help of something as concrete, as objective as a chronography. But in fact the connection between the material and myself had quite another dimension. Every issue of the magazines I used contained the writings of my father, Hikmet. Munir Ebcioglu, who was a news reporter and a commentator on the world of radio. Every issue contained the familiar faces of the radio artists I knew, and was filled with all the little things that bring back the time in which they lived: the way they sat or stood, the way they held their arms, their gestures and expressions, all the things that were so much a part of my early childhood memories.

The series of prints emerged when I was able to summon opurage to draw closer to the world de the wagezines. extracted from their contexts the pictures of six differ de ceom sed

that they should make up a section to be called "Time as it Was."

In a second section called "Time in Colour" I made full use of the most advanced form of traditional lithography, offset printing, enhancing it with some artistic interventions. At times I even used hand-drawn films, and all of these chings added to be special pleasure I got from this work.
